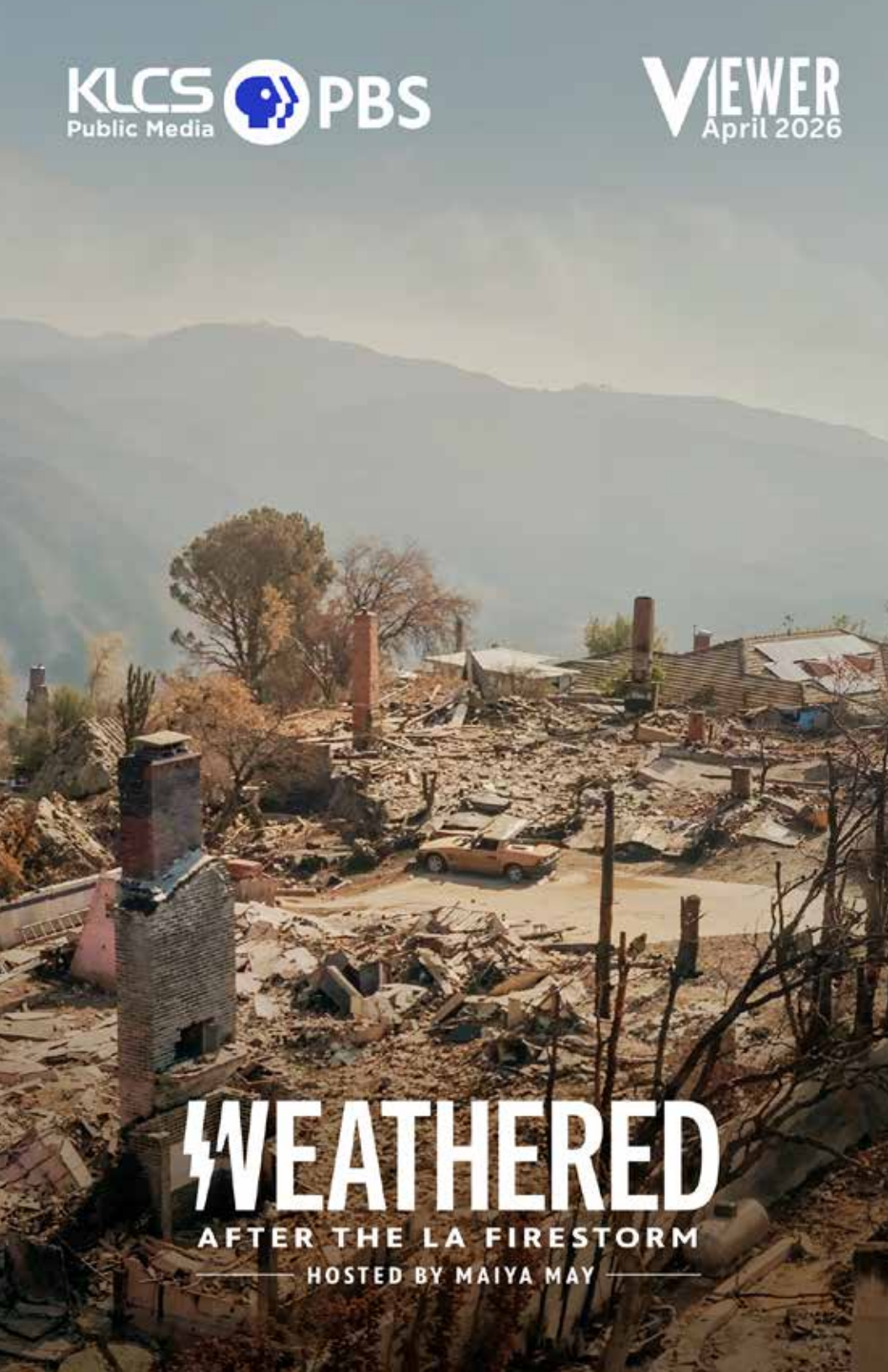

May follows survivors through the wreckage as they confront the questions that haunt their sleepless nights: Why did the systems meant to protect them fail? Could different choices have saved their homes? And most critically, how do we ensure this never happens again?



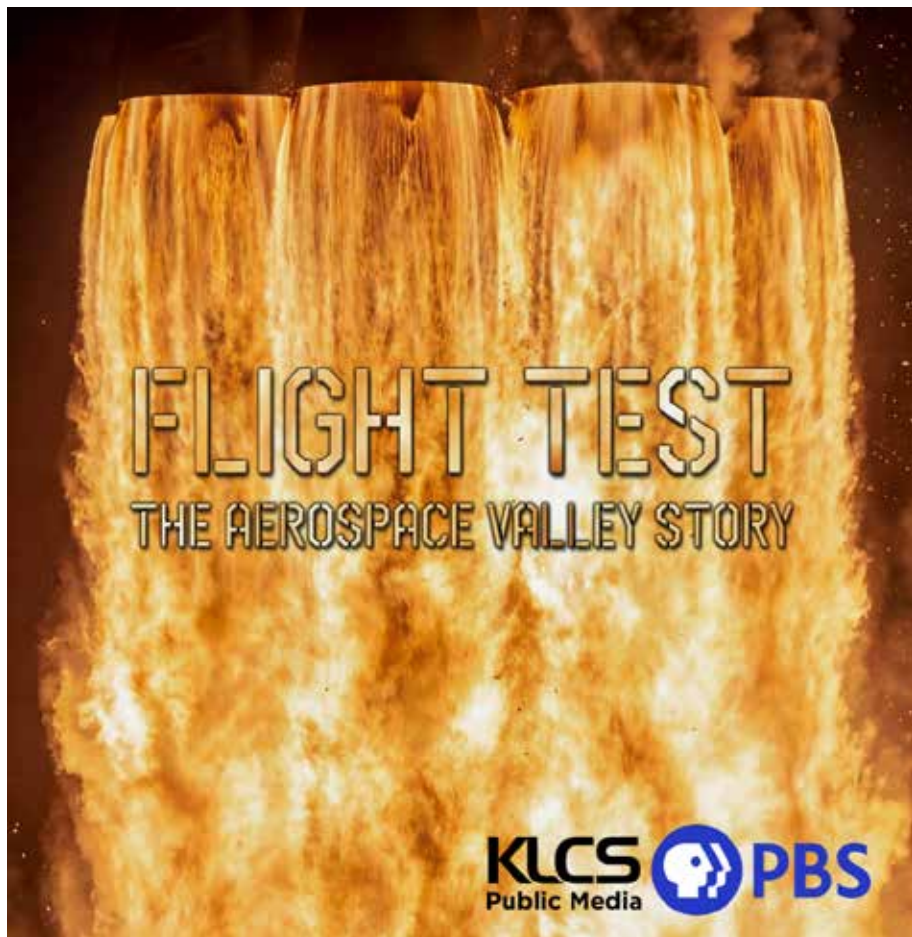

FLIGHT TEST: THE AEROSPACE VALLEY STORY



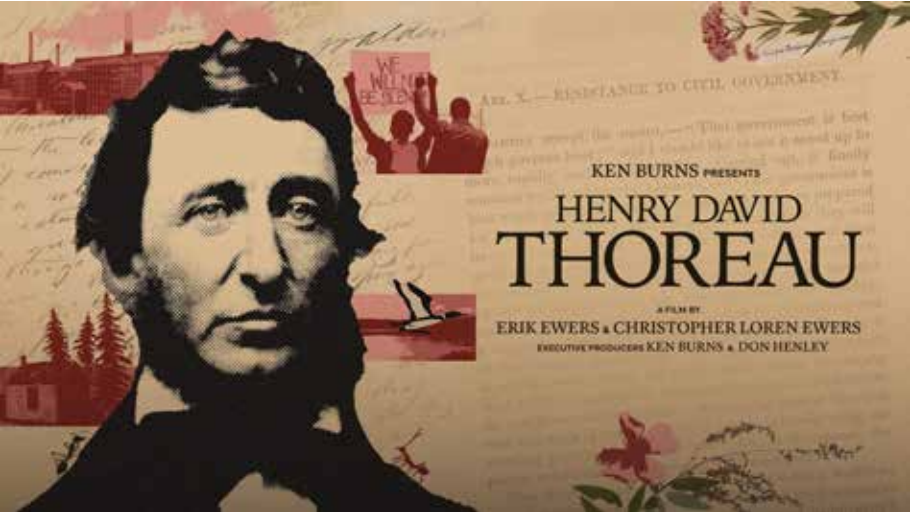
From the moment Chuck Yeager shattered the sound barrier in 1947, California's Aerospace Valley has served as one of the world's most important proving grounds for aviation and space innovation. Stretching from the guarded gates of U.S. Air Force Plant 42 to the Mojave Air and Space Port, this desert corridor has played a pivotal role in the design, development, and flight testing of revolutionary aircraft and spacecraft. Home to experimental programs such as the North American X-15 that helped open the door to the space age and iconic aircraft like the sleek Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird redefined the limits of speed and altitude.

Today, Aerospace Valley remains at the forefront of aerospace innovation. Legacy companies including Northrop Grumman, Boeing, and Lockheed Martin continue to advance cutting-edge systems alongside emerging pioneers such as Stratolaunch, Blue Origin, and Joby Aviation.

Through interviews with aerospace leaders and flight test professionals, **FLIGHT TEST** provides rare access to the engineers, researchers, and test pilots shaping the next generation of hypersonic aircraft and reveals how this remarkable region continues to transform bold ideas into the aircraft and spacecraft that will define the future of flight.

HENRY DAVID THOREAU



HENRY DAVID THOREAU examines the life and work of the 19th-century writer in the context of antebellum New England and the larger United States, as well as through the universal themes he focused on in his writings: an individual's relationship to the state, how to live an authentic life, our connection to nature, and the impact of race on American life. Set against the political and social tensions of the mid-19th century, the film traces Thoreau's journey from his early days in Concord, Massachusetts to his deep engagement with the moral crises of his time, including industrialization, slavery, war, and environmental degradation. Through his essays, journals, and landmark works such as *Walden* and *Civil Disobedience*, he became an inspiration for generations of writers, thinkers, and activists.

Narrated by George Clooney and featuring the voices of Meryl Streep, Jeff Goldblum, and Ted Danson, this first full-length documentary devoted to the transcendentalist pioneer weaves archival riches with newly filmed cinematography in Concord and beyond. Tune in and meet one of the country's greatest writers and among the most enduring thinkers and artists of what came to be known as the Transcendentalist Movement in America. As the nation prepares to mark the 250th anniversary of its founding, the film offers a timely meditation on democracy, nature, and the responsibilities of citizenship.

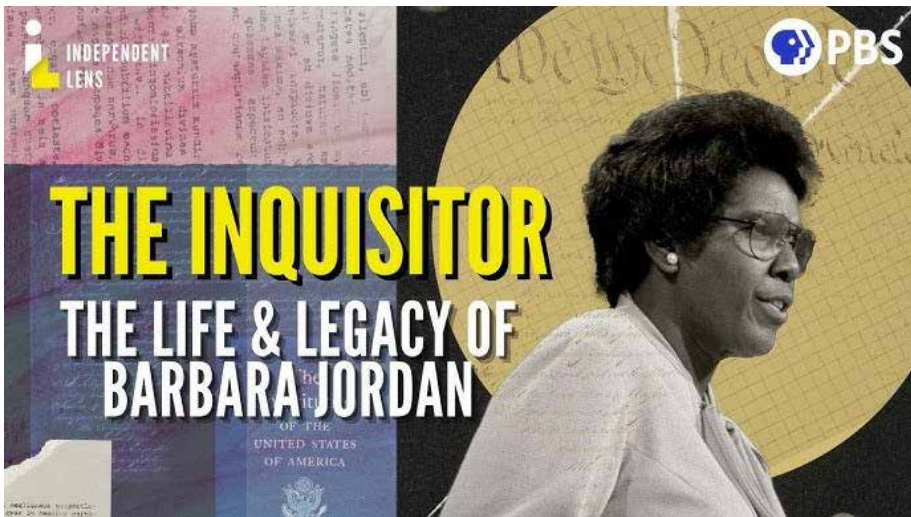

THE INQUISITOR



Independent Lens presents **The Inquisitor**—The Life & Legacy of Barbara Jordan, a documentary that traces the extraordinary trajectory of a woman who rose from the segregated streets of Houston to become the first Black congresswoman from the South. Her journey is not merely a political ascent; it is the story of a moral compass for a nation in turmoil.

Witness Jordan's defining moments: her powerful presence during the Richard Nixon impeachment hearings, her relentless work to extend the Voting Rights Act, and her piercing interrogation of Supreme Court nominee Robert Bork. Each instance reveals a woman of unshakeable integrity, whose command of the Constitution and rhetorical power could silence a chamber and sway a nation.

Yet this portrait goes beyond the public record. Through rare archival footage and intimate accounts, **The Inquisitor** unveils the private burdens Jordan carried—the health struggles, the personal sacrifices, the weight of being a trailblazer in an era that often resisted her very presence. This not merely a biography, this film is an examination of conscience, principle, and the enduring cost of moral courage.

THE COUNT OF MONTE CRISTO



Masterpiece presents an epic retelling of Alexandre Dumas' timeless classic, **The Count of Monte Cristo**—a sweeping saga of betrayal, justice, and transformation that spans two decades and three continents. The journey begins with Edmond Dantès, a young sailor on the verge of marriage and captaincy, whose bright future is shattered by a false accusation of treason. During his solitary confinement of the Château d'If, he meets Abbé Faria, an imprisoned priest who unlocks not only the mystery of a hidden fortune but the purpose that will consume Dantès for the rest of his life.

After escaping the notorious island fortress, Dantès claims the treasure and emerges transformed. Episode by episode, viewers will witness his meticulous return to society as the enigmatic Count of Monte Cristo. From the unsettling tension of "The Red Room," where he confronts his former fiancée Mercedes, to the glittering manipulations of Parisian high society in "Providence," the Count weaves a web of calculated exposure. The stakes culminate in a dramatic duel with Albert, the son of his most despised enemy, and reach their final reckoning in "The Last Two," where the Count must confront whether redemption is possible after a lifetime of revenge.

Forget everything you think you know about food television. **Wild Foods** with Kevin Chap isn't another competition or studio-bound cooking demonstration. This is a visceral journey to the very origins of what we eat. Host Kevin Chap—a renowned environmentalist, educator, and professional forager—guides viewers to witness the revolution happening at the root of our food system. This series is a deep dive into agroecology, exploring how the "rewilding" of our agriculture can restore our habitat. Each episode follows Kevin as he harvests wild, local ingredients, culminating in an authentic, communal feast prepared alongside regional chefs.



Wild Foods positions Indigenous cultures and First Nations peoples as central voices, bridging millennia of traditional ecological knowledge with modern sustainability challenges. Explore how ancient wisdom offers viable solutions for regenerative agriculture and long-term ecological resiliency. **Wild Foods** doesn't just show you a new location; it invites you to reconsider your relationship with the natural world, one ingredient at a time.

LUCY WORSLEY INVESTIGATES: THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION

It was the break-up that gave birth to a superpower, and in this new series, historian Lucy Worsley is looking at the split from the other side of the Atlantic. On the eve of America's 250th anniversary, Worsley dissects the explosive 18th-century rupture between Britain and its 13 colonies, asking the provocative question: could this war have been avoided?

The two-part investigation is packed with vivid, original evidence. In the first episode, Worsley takes us to New York's City Hall Park, where the Declaration of Independence was first read to Washington's troops—a rallying cry so potent that rebels tore down a gilded statue of King George III and melted it into musket balls.



The second episode reveals how the war's chaos reverberated back in Britain. Worsley investigates a shocking arson plot to set the Royal Navy ablaze in Portsmouth and uncovers a web of transatlantic espionage. She traces Benjamin Franklin's secret mission to Paris, the double-crossing of British spy Edward Bancroft, and the growing panic in London as France and Spain joined the fray. Concluding at the site of America's first London embassy, Worsley reveals how this war didn't just create a new nation; it fundamentally reshaped the old one.

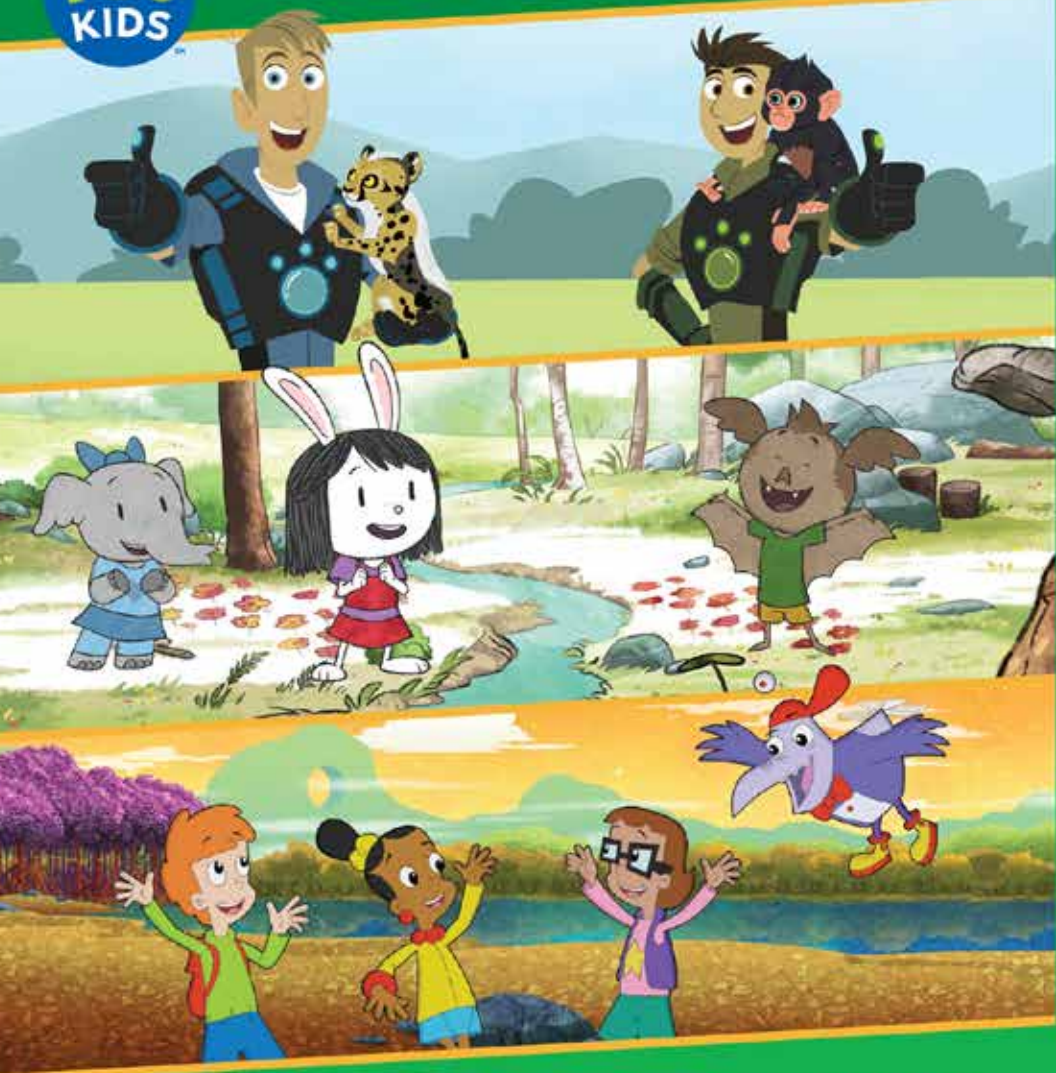

KLCS INTERVIEW SPOTLIGHT

If you've caught our new musical spark on Friday nights, you know **My Music with Rhiannon Giddens** is unlike anything else on TV. But how did this sublime collaboration between a GRAMMY-winning artist and a seasoned filmmaking duo actually come to be? We sat down with the wonderfully engaging producers behind the show, the husband-and-wife team Will and Deni McIntyre, to get the inside story. From the show's origins to their path as PBS producers, here is a lively and insightful peek into the journey of bringing *My Music* to the screen.



Deni, Will what was the path that led you to TV?

Deni: We spent decades as still photographers, but always on locations. We were never advertising; we were mostly editorial. And did a lot of work for national magazines and back in the day when corporations had printed annual reports, we would shoot the front of the book for different multinational corporations. So, we always travelled a lot; we always worked on location. After 9/11, when all the planes were grounded and nobody was going anywhere, we got our first movie camera and started to try to figure out what we were doing with that. [We] ended up shooting a lot of PSAs for nonprofits, because we were just giving them that, in case we screwed up (laughs) and needed not be paid because it wasn't any good. We started giving work away, then we would find our feet. And that's what happened, and we started doing the motion version of what we had always done as still photographers, which is basically documentary, not hard journalistic stuff, but featured docs.

Will: Then our producer down at PBS NC said, "Hey, you guys are connected with the music community, you ought to do something with music. And that's when we called up our friend David Holt, who'd been playing with Doc Watson for 14 years, and he'd just come off the road. Doc was ready to retire and we said, "Hey, let's do something with the music," and he said, "Perfect!"

Deni: Traditional music, basically acoustic, occasional forays into electric, but mainly guitar, fiddle, banjo, base, mandolin. And David is a 4-time GRAMMY winner, and had a lot of cred for touring with Doc Watson.

Will: So, we did six [episodes] with David, and then our first season of *David Holt State of Music*, Rhiannon was one of the guests. When David said he was ready to step down and retire and he got Parkinson's Disease, we said, "Ok we need to find someone to host." And we called up Rhiannon thinking we would get more than one person.

Deni: Rotating host, like one per episode or something. And we thought that we'd call other musicians, some of the musicians that we now knew from them having been a guest on David's show. But Rhiannon was right up at the top.

Will: Rhiannon said, "I'll be happy to host one episode like you're saying, but I'd be happy to host the whole series."

Deni: We said, "Oh boy! Now we're going to have fun because she was a guest on David's show in 2015 or 2016, and by the time we came to her to host, it was like 2021, and she was super busy. She had been commissioned by Spoleto (Festival USA) in Charleston to write an opera that was supposed to premiere the year that Covid happened.



Funding always seems to be an issue for a PBS show; some shows can't do a season two. How did you find funding to do this?

Will: So, that's my job (laughs) and I had to laugh when you said funding is always a problem. It is always an issue. We've been very fortunate; we've had several funders who have stepped up. The first one to come on board with David's show was the Ray Bigelow Foundation, and they have

helped us all the way through to the first season of Rhiannon's series. We've had a lot support here locally, because we're in the middle of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Deni: This is such a traditional hot bed for traditional music. That's one of the selling points to this area, it attracts a lot of people to this area.

Will: So we've had a lot of support locally from the Community Foundation of Henderson County, North Carolina. They have supported us through every single season we've done. They've given us a tremendous amount of support.



That brings me to the question, I also noticed you are credited as the Will and Deni Foundation. Most are people form production companies; does that mean there's a charitable component to your foundation?

Deni: We're a 501c3

Will: Our role model was a guy named Ken Burns. He's done some things. We looked at what he did in [producing] public television work, and we just decided that rather than go out and look for fiscal sponsorship, we were going to make our own foundation and be very transparent about what we were going to do with the money. And for us that's been easier than going and looking for fiscal sponsorship.

Deni: As a 501c3, there are some rules that you have to clear.

Season Two, that was the season where Rhiannon collaborated with Silk Road, so the whole season was that topic. Did she join the band and then you decided that would be the whole season?

It's funny, because the title of the series, *My Music with Rhiannon Giddens*, we were going to do it like "My Music with Molly Tuttle, My Music with Jerry Douglas..." *My Music with Rhiannon Giddens* turned out to be the perfect title because Rhiannon is involved in so many different kinds of projects that we said, "Ok, we're just going to catch on to the tail of this comet, and ride it." The only way that we could get on her calendar was to do whatever she was doing right then. So, the first year we did kind of the mentors; we got some North Carolina people and several women of color that she was really cementing relationships with and wanted to lift up as a sort of impresario. But then, Yo-Yo Ma had founded Silk Road, and by the 20-teens, he felt like, I guess, he had done everything he could do with them and he left and they approached Rhiannon be artistic director. She is the sitting artistic director of Silk Road, so she's had that going before we even started the series.
