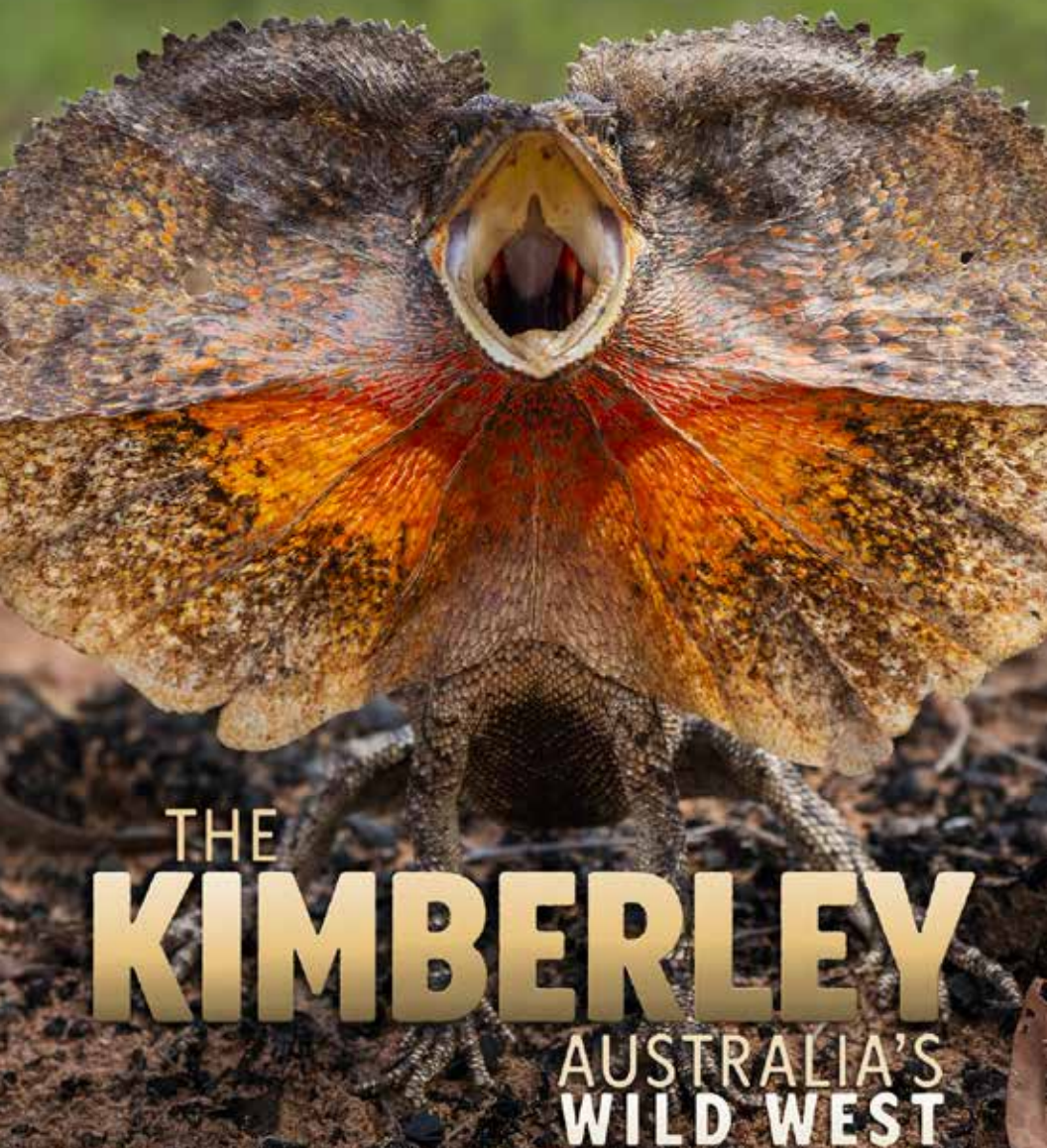

In the harsh rugged northwest of Australia there lies a hidden world that has never been caught on camera - until now. The Kimberley spans over 400,000 square kilometers of vast environments; from tropical wilderness, sandy deserts, and sprawling savannahs, there are worlds yet to be uncovered.

Over this three-part series you'll embark on a year-long journey through a First Nations' perspective on the seasons of the Kimberley. In the intense dry heat of Lalin, wallabies risk their lives against the fearsome crocodiles hidden in the last rivers. Take to the skies in the season of Koolawa as shorebirds fatten up on the riches of the mudflats. As things cool during the season of Barkanna humpback whales ride along the turquoise coasts, while lizards on land prepare once again for the intense heat of Lalin.

This untouched wilderness is under threat, and as these creatures fight for survival, so too do the ecologists and First Nations Rangers as they watch over the land. Rangers fight wildfires, evade dangerous animals, and traverse extreme landscapes all to protect these incredible places. Now you too can follow along in the quest to protect the Kimberley, witnessing resilience and survival unlike anything you've seen before.

As the Graham Dance Company nears its landmark 100th anniversary, Partisan Pictures has spent the last three years watching every step, spin, and sacrifice of the dancers who carry the legacy onward. Woven throughout their performances are the ideas of founder Martha Graham herself: "No artist is ahead of his time. He is his time."



Often listed alongside household names such as Picasso and Stravinsky, Graham upended classical tradition with a striking style of movement. These stunning sequences and verité storytelling have danced through the decades; each student adding their own voice to the chorus. Today, the studio in its centennial year asks the same question that started it all: what does it mean to create "American" art?

Following dancers across generations, **Martha Graham Dance Company: We Are Our Time** will show you behind the scenes development never before released to the public. It captures the passion and urgency required to keep not just a dance studio alive, but the legend of Martha Graham herself. HIROSHIMA GROUND ZERO: EYEWITNESS ACCOUNTS OF 78 A-BOMB SURVIVORS

On August 6th, 1945, the United States deployed the first ever atomic bomb, the A-Bomb, on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. The result? A “death zone” where the sun touched the earth, killing anywhere from 150,000 to 246,000 people with a mortality rate of 94.6%. Yet even right where the bomb landed, 78 people survived.



Now, for the first time ever, the 110 hours of interviews with the survivors are being made available to the public. With these new first-hand accounts, researchers can use collected evidence and the latest technology to learn what really happened at “Ground Zero”. Exactly how did these survivors escape the destruction within the 500-meter hypocenter?

With in-depth reporting from Japan’s national newsgroup NHK, you’ll meet historians, experts, and descendants of these survivors and hear their pleas of peace. These shocking experiences, along with new scientific visualizations, help to paint a harrowing picture as we remember the tragedies that came before us, and work to prevent more in the future.

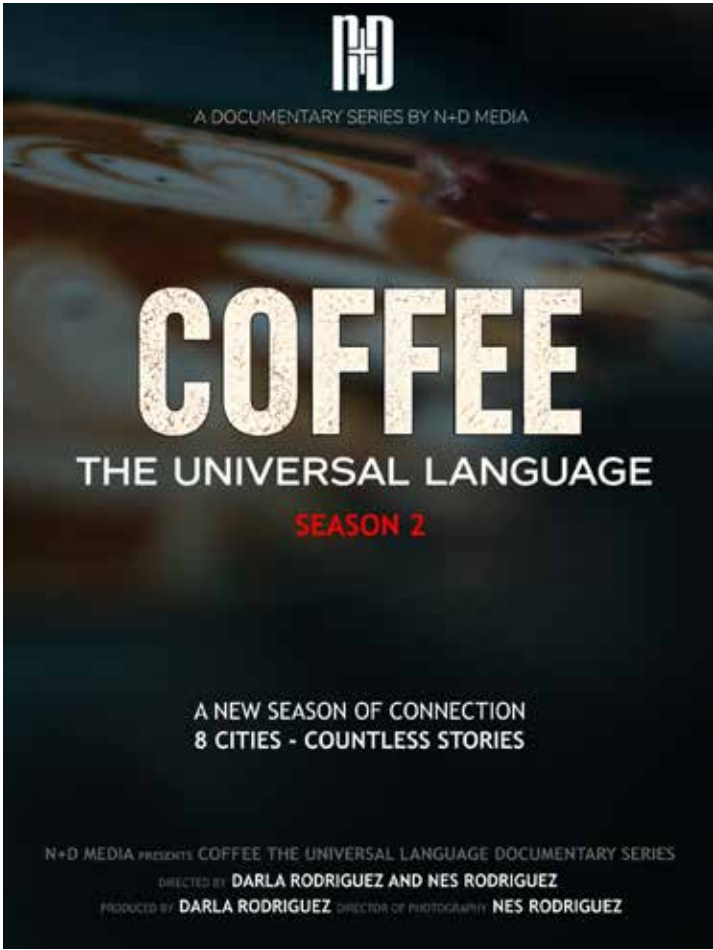

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KLCS INTERVIEW SPOTLIGHT

Refresh Quest is a regional travel show that is more about the experience than about the travel. Presented by KLCS, we talk to local filmmaker Jeremy Maupin about how this now-E Emmy nominated show came about, his journey to KLCS and his love for PBS, and what filmmakers might care about, like the hard costs of travel and B-roll!



What was your path, your journey to this show?

My journey's all over the map. I love a little bit of everything, I'm one of those guys if you asked me what do I listen to with music, I would tell you – a little bit of everything. I don't have one part of life, where I'm like, "I only like this." For me, like is fun because there's so many choices. And I like to explore so many different avenues of art, or life, or, whatever it might be – people, conversations, topics of conversations. It doesn't matter what it is, like for me, I'm like, "hey, I like that" and I can get into it. So my journey to this program (laughs), I'll give you the short version. I moved to Los Angeles to pursue acting, I have a medical background before that, then I decided I was going to go to L.A. to pursue acting. Came to Los Angeles, pursued acting, in the arts, which was great. And one of my best buddies was already living in L.A. and he was a surfer. And he was a music therapist. And he used music therapy.



So what was your path to KLCS?

I submitted it (laughs) originally to SoCal PBS and SoCal loved the idea. And they saw us and they immediately were like, "Hey, we want it,

we like you guys a lot. Great, let's go forward." So I was like, "Cool!" I was so pumped, because it was my first time sending something out to a station from this perspective and getting almost an immediate response of "Yes." And I was like, "Woah! That's so cool!" Just like you, I grew up with PBS. I'm from Stockton, so my station was in Sacramento, which is KDIE. And I grew with Sesame Street, Mr. Rogers, Wild America, you name it, that's what my mom made us watch as kids (laughs), The Electric Company. All of those is what we grew up on. So for me, I already had a connection to PBS, and the education, and the entertainment, and the good values that was taught. and I felt like if I can give back to that as well, and create something for not just children, but adults too, but if I could give back, that would be amazing. So that was my connection with PBS. Going back to SoCal, SoCal had trouble fitting us into the lineup and ultimately they decided that they were go a different direction for a travel series. But the lady that I spoke to there said, "Hey look, I think you're so talented that I don't want you to just fade away. I don't want this to be nothing." So she said, "I have a contact over at KLCS, I have to refer you to them." I was like, "Cool!" For me, I didn't know the difference between any of the stations in Southern California. So when KLCS got a hold of me, I was just as excited, just as stoked. And they watched a few of my episodes, and they were like, "Hey, we want to bring you on." And I was like, "Awesome! Let's do it, fantastic!"



Are you related to Armistead Maupin?

I don't know the connection, but I'm sure I am. I've been asked that ever since I was a kid. And I always tell people I've never met him and I'm sure somewhere along the path we are. The Maupin name is linked, I know the heritage, I've been told from my grandmother and grandfather how we got here to America, the whole thing.

I did notice you have a lot of shows in Northern California. Your marble show, you had Jonathan your cameraman, he

was also your other buddy in that episode. So that means that the hard costs of travelling, you stay where you stay...

Yes, exactly. For me I've gotten to a point where so far I've been lucky enough to have enough savings where I've set aside my own money for things like this. For my art. And whether it'd be spent on this, or something else, with me in a different direction of art, this was like my little nest egg of, "Ok, I have some funding for my own (laughs) self preservation for my art, so like - hotel stays, flights, of course food, all of those add up pretty quick when you're traveling. People ask when they see the show, and they say, "Oh, you must be a millionaire by now," (laughs) because you're travelling all over the place. I'm like, "No, but I'm very good at showcasing places and events that seem more widespread than they probably really are, as far as the show's concerned. Now, of course I've been to the Midwest, and I've been to different states as well, because northern California, I'm very familiar with,

because that's where I was born and raised. I've sent now more than half my life in southern California. I do think, and this may not even be true, but for me, what I've found is northern California is easier to film than southern California.



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
